

SESSION AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS - JANUARY

- **Congregational Meeting and annual committee reports** – Due to pandemic restrictions, UPC will remotely conduct its Annual Congregational Meeting (AGM) for 2021. The meeting is required by the PC-USA's Book of Order to approve the Ruling Elder and Deacon officer slate, the nominating committee candidates, the details of the Pastor Call. This AGM business will be addressed at the beginning of the Joys and Concerns after-worship Zoom videoconference on Sunday, Feb. 7. Then, in the weeks to follow, chairs of the UPC committees will provide their own updates of the past year. These will be publicized through the Friday InTouch e-mail newsletters.
- **Earthcare update** – The solar panels that were approved by Session in May are being installed in the church parking lot. These will provide more cost-efficient and sustainable power to UPC, and will offer shade to the parked cars. The Session also approved the committee's annual report and application to PC-USA to renew UPC's involvement in the effort.
- **Sanctuary renovation** – The campus planning task force is identifying specific improvements and locating funding to equip the sanctuary for flexibility and healthier airflow to accommodate the congregation when public health officials deem it appropriate for congregants to return to inside worship. The Session approved a portion of the expenditures so the project can move forward.
- **Lenten groups** – The Pandemic Advisory task force has developed guidelines for UPC to host Lenten virtual or outside group discussions. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17. This year's conversations will be based on "Forgiveness" by Marjorie Thompson.

CHRISTIAN PEN PALS: UPC'S NEW PRISON-RELATED MINISTRY

In keeping with the text of Matthew 25 and the tenets of being a Matthew 25 church, UPC is calling for volunteers as we embark on a new prison-related ministry: [Christian Pen Pals](#).

What is Christian Pen Pals?

Christian Pen Pals (CPP) is an organization that matches volunteer pen pals (age 18+) with inmates that are incarcerated. Inmates are male and female and can be incarcerated anywhere in the nation. Volunteering with CPP is a way for UPC members and sojourners to engage with an inmate in a COVID-safe way and within the structure of an established program.

What does a volunteer do?

The hope is that pen pals will write to their inmates around twice per month; the cost of postage is part of the volunteer commitment. UPC's mailing address will be used as the return address for letters from the inmates, and UPC Pen Pals will be notified when they have received a letter. The focus of the letter-writing should be on building a positive relationship, and if stories of faith and spiritual encouragement are shared, that is welcome. Why is UPC joining CPP now?

This opportunity was brought to the Mission, Outreach and Justice Committee by UPC member Janice Zitelman, who has been a Christian Pen Pal along with her husband Fred since 2016. Janice says: "The ministry has afforded us a lens into the prison system and shows us some of the struggles of our brothers and sisters from different backgrounds than ourselves. Such a lens increases our understanding of the human condition and helps us to empathize more with others. The four men we have been corresponding with bring many blessings to us: we write to them and pray for them, and they also offer prayers for our wellbeing. It has been a meaningful experience for us."

TREASURER'S REPORT

Thanks to all who kept up with their pledges in 2020 and to the many new members and visitors who have made donations. UPCC and the church allocated most of the funds for the SBA Paycheck Protection Loan in support of staff employment. Expenses continue to be lower than planned though we have been upgrading technology. We have a healthy balance in most of the special funds which are non-operating funds, usually designated for a particular purpose. The overall balance in the special funds account is \$492,736 which includes a very generous anonymous donation of \$125,000 which will be used to seed some campus improvements focusing on making the sanctuary more audio/visual friendly. We ended 2020 with a surplus of \$94,468 which will be used to fund sanctuary improvements and to close some of the 2021 budget deficit. The solar panel project is moving forward and should be completed in the beginning of 2021. The SoL Center offers interfaith adult education and has an operating budget of \$34,825 and separate endowment accounts.

In addition to operating funds and special purpose funds, we also have Endowment Funds which are funds invested for the long term that help support programs of the church and The SoL Center. The current market value of UPC Endowments is \$634,359 and the book value is \$424,773. The current market value of SoL Endowments is \$145,197 and the book value is \$105,061. Endowments are invested and only the earnings or a percentage of the current value may be used regularly.

COVID-19 RELIEF FUND

The COVID-19 pandemic continues, and so does UPC's drive to respond through the COVID-19 Response Fund. Our church community has contributed approximately \$28,000, so thank you! So far, \$21,000 has been given to community nonprofit organizations serving those most impacted by the pandemic. \$3,500 has been given to families in our midst that are in need of assistance.

If you or someone you know needs some extra help with rent, utilities/internet, groceries, healthcare expenses, transportation expenses, childcare expenses, or other essentials, please reach out to your Deacon or [Pastor Dries Coetzee](#) (UPC) or to [Cindi Catlin Gaskins](#) (UPCC). A subcommittee will review and respond to these requests confidentially and as quickly as possible.

Thank you for all you have done-and all you will continue to do-to help UPC respond to this crisis with compassion and in alignment to our Mission and Welcome Statement. Your generosity to the COVID-19 Response Fund and by maintaining your UPC pledge makes that possible. There is always time to contribute! We will continue to respond faithfully as long as the need exists.

I/CAN YEAR-END UPDATE (INTERFAITH/COMMUNITY ACTION NETWORK)

2020 has been an active year for I/CAN. Still in its developing stages as a San Antonio community-change organization, I/CAN established its logo, a Facebook Page, and a website (www.icansa.org), which provide a means to communicate our work and give community-wide access. We partnered with COPS-Metro to advocate that City Council approve expedited funding for a COVID CARES Act Workforce Development Program, which was added to the November ballot and passed. After the shooting deaths of George Floyd and Breonna Taylor, we established a relationship with the San Antonio Police Department to understand their policies and advocate for change. Two law enforcement issues are scheduled to appear on the local ballot in May, and while I/CAN recognizes the need for protections from union organization, it also acknowledges that bad actions cannot be allowed to shelter in in those protections.

Through multiple meetings a month, with leadership planning and small group discussions, I/CAN expanded its Family Action Agenda in the face of both the upcoming national election and the COVID-19 pandemic (<https://icansa.org/family-action-agenda/>). We met with political candidates to outline our Agenda and prepare for the Online I/CAN / TBO Political Accountability Session, held via Zoom on October 18th and attended by 140 community members (30 from UPC) and 8 area candidates. In 2021, we will work to hold our elected State and Federal officials accountable to the Family Action Issues, while also directing our focus to meet with local candidates in preparation for the San Antonio elections in May. We will host ongoing small group meetings to develop an Agenda of local issues, and are planning an Accountability Session on April 18th to help you meet your candidates. 2021 is a chance to grow stronger, together. Stay tuned for ways you can play your part.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS

Children's ministry is in a strange state during the COVID-19 pandemic.
